





We were pleasantly surprised to see several new faces and returning families for our Fall Ball programs. We operated our largest fall lacrosse season, ever, and our teams participated in indoor and outdoor leagues. Our fall season concluded with a competitive showing at the Space Needle Shootout across all ages.


During the spring season, our most significant program, we were able to return to play with 120 participants. With seven teams, ranging from Kindergarten through 12th grade, our student-athletes played a full season of games in the Greater Eastside Lacrosse League (youth) and Washington State High School Boys Lacrosse Association.

The highlight of our spring season was winning the 2022 4A State Championship, our second state title in program history. Varsity standouts Marcus Ball, Carter King, Hunter Neil, and Joe Vermeulen were recognized for their strong play and named to All King-Co teams.

Carter King was named a Washington State All-American for his dominant play on the field and Aidan Grace was recognized as a USA Lacrosse Academic All-American for his hard work in the classroom and on the field.

After the end of the school year multiple Skyline teams traveled to Bend, Oregon to compete in the Hot Shots Invitational, with our High School team winning the Elite Division. Additionally, we successfully operated multiple youth camps and dropin games throughout the summer.

Financial Report

For the fiscal year ending July 31st, 2022, the club generated a loss of \$11,915. The club was able to absorb the loss as in prior years we have had been operating at a surplus.

As of August 1st, 2022 the club has bank accounts with a total balance of \$46,276. The club remains in a strong financial position.

The total revenue of the club for the 12 months was \$159,541 of which the main sources of income were as follows:


